- They are calling for a 67% chance for above average season.
- Our first named storm may develop in the next few days.


Get ready for Hurricane Season

- Know your zone
- Build a survival kit
- Keep in touch
- Stay in the know
- Know your Employers Emergency Plan



Know your zone

- Truth in Millage (TRIM) notice
- Utility Bill
- Front of telephone white pages



If you have to evacuate

- Find out TODAY where you will go
- Can you stay with a friend (host home)?
 - Offer to help them prepare their home
- Bring your survival kit with you
- Keep your car ready Fuel up



Build a survival kit

Gotta Haves...

- Water One gallon per person per day
- Non-Perishable food for 7 days
- Medications/Rx
- First Aid Kit
- Important Papers
- Flashlight
- Portable Radio & Earphones
- Extra Batteries
- Phone and Charger

Also consider...

- Infant formula and diapers
- Needs for elderly family members
- Pet needs (food, carrier, leash, rabies tag)
- Activities for Children
- Cash
- Clothing



Don't Spend a lot of money

- You might already own most items
- Buy a little bit at a time
- Purchase only what you will use
- Check your supplies
 - Look for expired goods and replace old items with new ones
 - Keep in a central location



What is Special Needs Evacuation?

- If you require MINIMAL Medical Assistance
- Electric- Dependant
- Memory impairment
- Transportation assistance
- You MUST Register in Advance Prior to a storm NOT during the storm.

Special Needs Evacuation What to bring:

- Portable Oxygen or Concentrator
- Wheelchair or Walker
- Medicines (2 week supply)
- Nebulizer
- Blanket, Pillow, Cot or Air Mattress
- Clothing & Activities
- Special Dietary Items
- Written Medical Orders or Medical Information



Other things to consider

- Don't have your own transportation?
 - PSTA can help, bus service is free to shelters when a storm evacuation is declared
- Evacuate when ordered to
 - Prepare during a watch
 - Leave when warned
 - Don't "Wait to see what happens"
 - ALL Mobile Homes MUST Evacuate

Other things to consider

- Do you rent?
 - What will your landlord do?
- Do you own a condo?
 - What does your HOA want you to do?
- Can you host friends who have to evacuate?
 - Yes but contact them early
 - Make a plan
 - Have a Generator



Other things to consider

- Verify you insurance coverage before a Storm is named
- Protect important documents
- Secure your Boat with Extra Lines
- Purchase a Generator and learn how to use it Safely
- DISCUSS Your Plan with Your Family

Pet Care Needs During Evacuations

- Pets are NOT Allowed in the same shelters as people.
- Make prior arrangements early for pets
- PC Animal Services can Transport pets to the County Animal Shelter
 - (With Prior Arrangements)
- Call 727-464-3800

So you don't have to evacuate...

- Keep your home in good repair
 - Check roof, caulk, weather stripping
- Fortify your home
 - Focus on Windows, Doors and Garage Door
 - Use a licensed contractor
- Get your yard in shape
 - Prune trees
 - Pick up loose items
 - Put Away Yard Furniture



Keep in touch

- Build a phone number contact list
 - Updated numbers for friends and relatives
- Who is your family's key point of contact?
 - Do others know this?
- Where will you and your family meet?
- What are work/school/caregiver policies?



Stay in the know....

- Weather Alert Radios
 - Fast warning from the local weather office
- Local Media (Radio, TV, Newspaper)
- ALERT PINELLAS
 - (888) 689-8905 from a cell phone
- Citizen Information Center (727) 464-4333
- READY PINELLAS app

Recovery

- Listen to the Media for updates
- Life will be disrupted Please Be Patient
- Please do not return home until Told
- Please Follow Instructions given by authorities
- Stay clear of fallen power lines
- Help each other

Recovery

- Report dangerous situations to 911
- Let your family/friends know you are OK
- Text messages work best (Even 911)
- Know that electrical service will take some time to repair, maybe even weeks
- Follow Debris Removal instructions
- Do Not Bag Up Storm Debris
