1. Flags for Gulf Blvd – We need to know our inventory of flags and other decorations to recommend a plan.

NEW BUSINESS

1. Town Picnic - The Mayor, MaryBeth Henderson, tasked us with organizing the Town Picnic October 14, 2023. Discussions regarding raffles and donations, the Thank You banner, music, recreation, snacks/desserts like popcorn, snow cones, cotton candy and volunteers. Marie will be the point person for volunteers and donations. Jolie (Deputy Clerk) will be the point person for picnic activities.
2. Landscape Architect with Stantec - Christy Herrig spoke of the Town's relationships with Stantec. It currently does not include Landscape Architect services. We need to publish an RFP. Christy and Marie have both worked on RFP drafts. These will be combined and passed to the Town Administrator for review. CJ Hoyt added that we should be clear about our long-range goals, including all future projects, for better pricing and uniformity.
3. LDU funding was discussed. We will start developing plans for a few items at a time. Discussed the need for each project to have bulleted lists to keep track of each component.
4. Discussed the signage and the fencing at Town parks to keep them uniform with Constitution Park.
5. Branding of Message Kiosks – tabled for future discussion.
