BUDGET and CONTRACT

Chief Holroyd and the Indian Shores Finance Director, Amy Lockhart, will present the police department annual estimated budget for FY27 and our town's cost. The Town's current fee for FY26 is \$649,019.00 for the year.

The Town's contract with Indian Shores for law enforcement services is set to expire September 30, 2026. The current contract includes the option to extend for an additional 5 years. The town will need to consider whether to extend the current contract for 5 years or renegotiate a contract.

At the writing of this memo, I have not received new contract details from ISPD, so I cannot make any specific recommendations at this time.

Attached you will find the contract signed in 2020 and the amendment signed in 2023.

**AGREEMENT FOR LAW ENFORCEMENT SERVICES
FOR THE TOWN OF REDINGTON SHORES
BY THE TOWN OF INDIAN SHORES**

WHEREAS, the Town of Redington Shores, Florida (hereinafter called "Redington Shores"), incorporated under Chapter 165, Florida Statutes, is desirous of the Town of Indian Shores, Florida (hereinafter called "Indian Shores"), continuing to furnish police protection to its inhabitants and citizens; and

WHEREAS, Florida Statute § 166.021(1) provides the power for a municipality to enter into agreements with other municipalities; and

WHEREAS, Article VIII, Section 4, of the Florida Constitution (1968), provides that by law or by resolution of the governing bodies of each of the governments affected, any function or power of a county, municipality or special district, may be transferred to or contracted to be performed by another county, municipality or special district, after approval by vote of the electors of the transferor and approval by vote of the electors of the transferee, or as otherwise provided by law; and

WHEREAS, Section § 166.0495, Florida Statutes, provides that a municipality may enter into an interlocal agreement with an adjoining municipality within the same county to provide law enforcement services within the territorial boundaries of the other municipality; and

WHEREAS, the Town of Redington Shores has requested that the Indian Shores Police Department (hereinafter called "the Police Department") continue to furnish police protection to the Town of Redington Shores on a full time basis, and do and perform any and all necessary and appropriate functions, actions and responsibilities of a police and law enforcement force for the Town of Redington Shores, using such members of the Police Department as the Chief of the Police Department deems appropriate in the fulfillment of such responsibilities; and

WHEREAS, it is the further desire of the Town Commission of the Town of Redington Shores that the full, complete and entire responsibility for law enforcement continue to be turned over to and performed by the Police Department on October 1, 2016, and ending on September 30, 2021, and renewal period of October 1, 2021, to September 30, 2026, and the extension approved from October 1, 2026 to September 30, 2031.

WHEREAS, this Agreement is a renewal and continuation, as modified, of the prior contact for law enforcement services entered into between the Town of Redington Shores and the Town of Indian Shores; and

WHEREAS, in order to accomplish this assignment of duties and responsibilities, the same requires the Town of Indian Shores Town Council, which is responsible for all fiscal and budgetary matters for the Town of Indian Shores, to approve and support the plan and program set out in this Agreement

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the premises, the Town of Redington Shores and the Town of Indian Shores hereby agree as follows:

1. By appropriate Resolutions, the Town Commission of the Town of Redington Shores shall declare that the Police Department shall continue to perform the duties and functions and have the power and authority of a police department for the Town of Redington Shores effective October 1, 2020, and continuing thereafter for a period of six years (6), or until September 30, 2026. An additional extension has been approved for a period of five (5) years from October 1, 2026, until September 30, 2031.

2. The Town Council of the Town of Indian Shores does hereby agree to assume the full and complete responsibility for providing appropriate and necessary law enforcement in and for the Town of Redington Shores directing the Chief of the Police Department to assign such members of the Police Department, as he deems necessary, to perform the duties and functions of a law enforcement officer for the Town of Redington Shores. The said Chief shall discharge his responsibility by the enforcement of state laws, county ordinances and municipal ordinances applicable within the Town of Redington Shores during the term of this contract. The name of the Police Department shall be the Indian Shores Police Department.

3. In the performance of his police and law enforcement duties for the Town of Redington Shores, the Chief or his Police Officers shall bring appropriate charges for all offenses which are violations of the ordinances of the Town of Redington Shores, in the County Court for Pinellas County, Florida, and the Circuit Court for Pinellas County, Florida, or such other county or other state court having appropriate jurisdiction of such offenses, which offenses shall be prosecuted by the State Attorney or the Town Attorney, at the Town of Redington Shores' cost, and fine or imprisonment or other punishment imposed by the Judge of the court.

4. It is understood and agreed that all fines and forfeitures rendered in any court shall be distributed in accordance with the general law and the administrative procedures of that court.

5. Pursuant to Florida Statute § the Town of Redington Shores agrees to transfer to Indian Shores each month, in addition to the monthly payment required by paragraph 8 below, the total amount of all monies received both from the assessment of two dollars (\$ 2.00) as a court cost against every person convicted for violation of a state penal or criminal statute or convicted for violation of a municipal or county ordinance and from the two dollars (\$2.00) received from every bond entresure or forfeited bail bonds related to such penal statutes or penal educational and training activities which conform to the requirements of §943.14, Florida Statutes.

6. The Town of Redington Shores will provide the annual opportunity to review and discuss the Police Department budget process prior to April 15th of each year for the life of this Agreement.

7. To allow for the exercise of the option to terminate by either Town as set forth in paragraph 10 of this Agreement, the Town of Indian Shores will develop a target budget for the Police Department. The target Police budget and annual cost, or costs, if a multi-year contract, for police service to the Town of Redington Shores will be established prior to April 15th of each fiscal year., to allow either Town (30) days to exercise the termination option with sufficient five months' notice, as required in paragraph 10 of this Agreement.

8. The fee for Police service to the Town of Redington Shores for the first twelve months, beginning on October 1, 2023, shall be \$594,479.00, which is thirty-five percent of the FY 2022/2023 annual budget of the Indian Shores Police Department as approved by the Town Council of the Town of Indian Shores. For each year thereafter, the annual fee for Police service to the Town of Redington Shores shall be thirty-five percent of that year's annual budget of the Indian Shores Police Department as approved by the Town Council of the Town of Indian Shores, but in no event, excepting substantial unanticipated and unusual expenses, shall any annual increase in the fee to the Town of Redington Shores exceed the fee charged by the Pinellas County Sheriff for the same level of deployment to Towns and Cities contracting Law Enforcement Services with the Sheriff. The annual fee for Police service to the Town of Redington Shores shall be paid in twelve equal monthly installments beginning on October 1st of the year in which the Police service is to be provided.

9. The Town of Indian Shores will appoint a Police Chief to oversee the day-to-day activities of the Police Department. The Chief of Police will act as a liaison with the Town of Redington Shores Mayor and Town Manager, as well as a liaison with the Indian Shores Administrative and Finance Committee, the Mayor and Town Council.

10. This Agreement shall take effect on October 1, 2023, and shall continue in effect thereafter unless hereafter amended by such terms and conditions as the parties hereto may later agree or terminated by either party with a minimum of five (5) months' notice prior to the end of a fiscal year.

11. In the event of any forfeiture by the Indian Shores Police Department of cash or other property having a value in excess of \$10,000.00 as a result of an action by the Indian Shores Police Department in the Town of Redington Shores, or arising out of law enforcement activity commencing in the Town of Redington Shores, and in the event such funds are ultimately used by the Town of Indian Shores in a manner consistent with §932.0755, Florida Statutes, that otherwise reduces the capital expenditures or operating cost of the Indian Shores Police Department, then the Town of Indian Shores shall grant to the Town of Redington Shores a credit on the next year's contract amount under this contract in an amount equal to one-third of the amount of such reduction.

12. To the extent allowed by the Insurance Carrier without additional premium, the Town of Indian Shores shall cause the Town of Redington Shores to be listed as a named insured on its policy of Police Professional Liability Insurance, insofar

As any acts or omissions of the Indian Shores Police Department might create liability of coverage under such policy.

13. Upon acceptance by both parties of this Agreement, it shall be recorded in the public records of Pinellas County, Florida by the Town of Indian Shores.

**AGREEMENT FOR LAW ENFORCEMENT SERVICES
FOR THE TOWN OF REDINGTON SHORES
BY THE TOWN OF INDIAN SHORES**

WHEREAS, the Town of Redington Shores, Florida (hereinafter called "Redington Shores"), incorporated under Chapter 165, Florida Statutes, is desirous of the Town of Indian Shores, Florida (hereinafter called "Indian Shores"), continuing to furnish police protection to its inhabitants and citizens; and

WHEREAS, Florida Statute § 166.021(1) provides the power for a municipality to enter into agreements with other municipalities; and

WHEREAS, in order to accomplish this assignment of duties and responsibilities, the same requires the Town of Indian Shores Town Council, which is responsible for all fiscal and budgetary matters for the Town of Indian Shores, to approve and support the plan and program set out in this Agreement

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the premises, the Town of Redington Shores and the Town of Indian Shores hereby agree as follows:

1. By appropriate Resolutions, the Town Commission of the Town of Redington Shores shall declare that the Police Department shall continue to perform the duties and functions and have the power and authority of a police department for the Town of Redington Shores **effective October 1, 2020, and continuing thereafter for a period of six (6) years which includes the final year of the existing contract and another five (5) year extension.**

2. The Town Council of the Town of Indian Shores does hereby agree to assume the full and complete responsibility for providing appropriate and necessary law enforcement in and for the Town of Redington Shores directing the Chief of the Police Department to assign such members of the Police Department, as he deems necessary, to perform the duties and functions of a law enforcement officer for the Town of Redington Shores. The said Chief shall discharge his responsibility by the enforcement of state laws, county ordinances and municipal ordinances applicable within the Town of Redington Shores during the term of this contract. The name of the Police Department shall be the **Indian Shores Police Department. However, all police vehicles and equipment will include a "Redington Shores" designation during the term of the contact.**

3. In the performance of his police and law enforcement duties for the Town of Redington Shores, the Chief or his Police Officers shall bring appropriate charges for all offenses which are violations of the ordinances of the Town of Redington Shores, in the County Court for Pinellas County, Florida, and the Circuit Court for Pinellas County, Florida, or such other county or other state court having appropriate jurisdiction of such offenses, which offenses shall be prosecuted by the State Attorney or the Town Attorney, at the Town of Redington Shores' cost, and fine or imprisonment or other punishment imposed by the Judge of the court.

4. It is understood and agreed that all fines and forfeitures rendered in any court shall be distributed in accordance with the general law and the administrative procedures of that court.

5. 9. The Town of Indian Shores, **with the Town of Redington Shore's Mayor and Police Commissioner's input**, will appoint a Police Chief to oversee the day-to-day activities of the Police Department. The Chief of Police will act as a liaison with the Town of Redington Shores Mayor and Police Commissioner, as well as a liaison with the Indian Shores Administrative and Finance Committee, the Mayor and Town Council.

10. 



Re: Emergency Operations Plan

In preparation for the upcoming staff and commissioner hurricane-preparedness training on April 30th, I have updated the town's Emergency Operations Plan. A draft will be provided.

LESSONS LEARNED

After Hurricanes Helene and Milton, we discovered that many areas of our plan needed updating. Example updates include:

- Adding the role of Town Manager. The current plan did not include this role because it was written before the position was created.
- COMMUNICATION with residents is highlighted throughout the plan.
- The updated plan includes much more Building Department planning:
 - Use of the Forerunner software program* for damage assessment data collection.
 - Preparing permit application paperwork packets.
 - Preparing for waiving of certain permit fees**. (*Upon Commission approval.*)
 - Incorporating new State Statute requirements.
- Ensuring remote work capabilities for critical staff. This includes: mobile hotspots, mobile phones, town-issued laptops that are set up with secure remote access.

The updated plan is also written to complement the Indian Shores plan. This is important since the Indian Shores PD is our Emergency Management Coordinator.

NEXT STEPS

I welcome feedback from the Commission. Once a final draft is ready, it will be sent to the attorney for review and then placed on a Regular meeting agenda for final approval.

Re: Redistricting Review

Redistricting typically occurs following the release of the decennial U.S. Census population totals. However, at the July 30, 2025 Workshop, Commissioners discussed district boundaries and decided to revisit the topic of an election district boundary review after the March 2026 election.

According to the Town Charter:

§ C-8. Election districts.

- A. The Board of Commissioners above-named shall divide, within 20 days of this Act becoming law, the territory lying within the municipal boundary of the Town of Redington Shores into four areas to be known as "districts." These four districts shall be created by the Board of Commissioners by dividing said territory such that each district shall contain as nearly as possible the same number of electors. The districts shall be numbered 1 to 4 in order, from south to north, with District No. 1 being that district lying most southerly within the municipal limits. Upon completion of the divisions of the territory into four districts, the Board of Commissioners shall forthwith prepare a map setting forth the four districts, showing their numbers and boundaries, and file the same with the Town Clerk, and a copy shall be provided for public inspection.
- B. Thereafter, the Board of Commissioners may from time to time by ordinance change the boundaries of said districts as it may deem expedient so that each district shall contain as nearly as possible the same number of electors. No change in districts shall be made within six months next preceding an election in said Town, and the election district so fixed by the Board of Commissioners pursuant to this subsection shall remain as so fixed until, in the judgment of the Board of Commissioners, a change may be necessary.
- C. In each instance where the Commission revises the boundaries of the districts, it shall, in addition to considering the numbering and population distribution requirements set forth in subsections (A) and (B) above, attempt to develop district boundaries which would prevent or make less likely the election of more than one Commissioner (excluding the Mayor-Commissioner) from any one homeowner or condominium association. The intent of this subsection is that no one condominium or homeowner association should hold a majority of the Town Commission seats.

Former Commissioner and current resident, Christy Herig, volunteered to take a first look at the project and report her recommendations.

Ms. Herig completed her review and submitted a draft for Commissioners to consider. The draft and her rationale will be distributed at the workshop. The objective of the exercise was to analyze the roll of active registered voters and create a district boundary map that captures approximate equal numbers of voters within each district.

Staff recommendation: review the proposed district boundaries and consider whether the presented draft is acceptable. If so, the next step would be to direct the Town Attorney to draft an Ordinance to reflect the changes.

The Building Department office is currently staffed by:

2 CAP employees:

- Building Official – Eve Spencer
- Permit Technician – Jenny Gonzalez

1 Town temporary “employee”:

- Administrative Support Specialist - Suzi McEwen

After the hurricanes in late 2024, the town contracted with an agency to fill a few temporary clerical staff positions – to assist with the Building Department. Suzi McEwen was one of those employees. After a certain amount of time, Suzi was able to transition out of the agency to a temporary position directly with the town. The benefit was a cost savings to the town.

At this time, the town should transition Ms. McEwen away from temporary status. CAP Government has indicated their interest in employing Ms. McEwen 3 days per week (24 hours). They have asked if the town would be interested in employing her for 2 days per week (16 hours). The current salary is \$21.00/hr. The salary for this position can be paid from the Building Department fund.

Options:

1. Create a new part-time administrative position in the Building Department.
2. Do not create a new position and do not renew the current temporary position which ends on 7-1-26.
3. Create a “floater” part-time administrative position that could also assist with occasional coverage in the Clerk’s Office.

Re: Disability Beach Access Mat

A resident inquired about the possibility of installing a disability beach access mat at the County Beach access. A disability beach access mat is a portable, non-slip, firm surface—often made of mesh—that rolls out over sand to allow wheelchair users, walkers, and strollers access to the shore. These mats create an ADA-compliant, stable pathway across soft sand, improving access for those with mobility challenges

I contacted Pinellas County for information. The Department of Environmental Protection permit that would be necessary for the project cannot be issued during turtle season. The deadline for application completion is April 30th. This means the town will need to apply closer to the end of turtle nesting season, which is around October 31st.

In the meantime, I will gather all the necessary information for application and competitive quotes for the mat itself. An update will be provided when the project is ready to begin.

Re: Movie in the Park for July 4th Holiday

Based on feedback from the Town Commission and Indian Shores Police Department at the April 8 Regular meeting, we have moved the July 4th event to Saturday, June 27.

Staff have secured Awesome Outdoor Cinema for the new date. The \$775 quote covers the projector, popcorn, and snow cone machine. The movie and licensing fee are not included. Licensing for audiences of 0-100 ranges from \$375 to \$495, depending on the title. The vendor recommends purchasing the chosen movie, as this may be more cost-effective than renting it.

Staff now ask the Town Commission to choose a movie for the event.

Movie Suggestions
